

The different ways to embed docsafe login into your website

1. Drop down login

Stage 1 - This needs to be added as the last piece of code in the head section of the webpage.

2. Integrated Login Boxes

Stage 1 - This needs to be added as the last piece of code in the head section of the webpage.

src="https://www.docserver1.co.uk/dsxc/client.js?acc=xx&custom_login=true"></script>

Stage 2 – This can be placed wherever you want the boxes to appear on your web page.

<!-- DOCSAFE LOGIN FORM – STYLE AS APPROPRIATE AND CHANGE acc PARAMTER TO YOUR DOCSAFE ID -->
<form>
  <input type="hidden" name="acc" value="xx" />
  email: <input type="text" name="email" /><br/>
  password: <input type="password" name="password" /><br/>
  <input type="submit" value="Login" /><br/>
  <a href="#" onclick=" dsxc_forgot()">forgot password</a>
</form>
```

3. Fully embed into a webpage

Stage 2 – This can placed in the body of your webpage.
